President's Report 2020

Hindsight is 2020

Who could have foreseen the changes and challenges we would face last year? We had our goals and hopes, but many changed when COVID 19 emerged. Proverbs 16:9 still rings profoundly true about 3,000 years after it was written: "In his heart a man plans his course, but the LORD determines his steps."

In spring 2020, just before COVID hit, Events
Coordinator Ashley Brochu had made plans for a
Spring Training Event for Saturday, April 4th. However,
with government restrictions not allowing onsite
gatherings, Ashely, with ingenuity and teamwork
including the IT expertise of our Communications &
Marketing Coordinator, Sandy Baldwin and our tech
savvy presenter, Sara Dasko pivoted to an online
format and conducted our first webinar...
with excellence.

Later, Ashley moved on to other pursuits and Darlene Penner expanded her role from Resources Coordinator to Training Coordinator. More volunteers were added to our training team and with Darlene's faithful direction, we hosted three more webinars in summer and fall. By collaborating with Southern Ontario Cooperative of ESL Ministries and by harnessing technology we welcomed participants from B.C. to Ontario and even from Ukraine! We faced the changes and challenges and with the Lord's help, we overcame!

Our founder and past president, Madeline Johnson went to be with Jesus on April 15th. She demonstrated faith, vision and courage throughout her life and leadership right up to her last breath. Her husband, Mel, describes a profound sense of God's presence and peace as she communed with the Lord while drifting in and out of consciousness. We are

grateful to Madeline for her example that continues to inspire us. Would you please pray for Mel and the Johnson family?

When I close my eyes and with holy imagination, I see followers of Jesus lined up at the borders of our nation with arms open and the welcome mat rolled out for people that arrive.

During one of our webinars, I asked attendees, "How many new Canadians benefit directly from you investing time, energy and money to attend today?" 



Incredibly, we finished the year in an even better position than when we started! Our dedicated board and staff members all work from home with office expenses being next to nothing.


Our team goes above and beyond what is required to provide training, resources and opportunities for connections—giving time, energy and money.

Through the faithful financial support of individuals, churches and a few businesses, we covered our expenses. Family and friends of Madeline Johnson donated to honour her memory in the months that followed her passing. Our fundraising hopes were far surpassed in December through a grant from The Pole Foundation and a matching program initiated by a donor who believes strongly in who we are and what we do. We exceeded our goal of \$10,000 and it turned into more than \$20,000 when the donations were matched. You might wonder what we have done with the extra donations. We decided to get this money working for us by establishing an investment income fund to provide monthly dividend income—much better than bank chequing or savings account interest.

What's Ahead in 2021

Expanding Our Reach

Our board and staff members met in the summer with Juan Manigault for a strategic planning session, then in the fall to articulate more goals. We read *The Choice* by Hoag, Rodin and Willmer and discussed how their premise impacts the way we measure success. The authors describe two paths: the common path that most churches and ministries take where leaders define success in terms of results, growth and expansion and the kingdom path where success is defined in terms of our obedience to the instructions of Jesus Christ for which He promises eternal rewards. They nailed it! The Lord is not nearly as concerned with our size (compare Gideon's army in Judges 7) as He is with our obedience.

Through prayer and discussion, we sensed the Lord leading us as we established the following goals:

One Year Goals:

- · Decide if we should incorporate federally.
- · Expand and build our network and consulting.
- Conduct two onsite and/or online training events.
- · Conduct two webinars.
- Conduct one Intercultural Communications Workshop.

Two-year goals:

- Look for someone to head up fundraising and someone to take over the Executive Director role (it would be a surprise bonus if one person could do both).
- Build a board of six members who support our vision and mission with their time, energy and money.
- Recruit and develop volunteer or paid leaders for five teams in training, resources, networking, consulting and fundraising.

Five-year goals:

- Build a board of eight members who support our vision and mission with their time, energy and money.
- Recruit and develop five teams to work with the leaders in training, resources, networking, consulting and fundraising.

What we see as obstacles, can be opportunities in the Lord's eyes. The COVID-19 restrictions forced us to think outside the box—or in our case, to think outside the Calgary area.

When restrictions ease, or are lifted, we will return to onsite events but still offer people from afar the opportunity to join us online through livestreaming at our onsite events.



We are also developing friendships and partnerships in many communities, provinces and nations. Mel Johnson encouraged me that Madeline would be pleased at how we live out Jesus' prayer for unity in John 17. Only the Lord knows where this will lead, but we are committed to obeying Him. —Allan Pole, CESLM President
