We conducted a "Let's Connect" session with Southern Ontario Cooperative of ESL Ministries in January, giving participants the opportunity to talk and pray online about their work with new Canadians. We hosted a webinar with Laura Swart in March on how to use storytelling to teach ESL. Our Spring Training Event was online in April and addressed the theme of "Building Bridges." The Fall Training Event was our first hybrid experience, with presenters and participants gathering at Falconridge Family Church and on Zoom to discuss "Change is in the Air." We distributed a monthly newsletter and added helpful resources to our website.

Statistics Canada reports record-high population growth in the year 2022

Canada's population was estimated at 39,566,248 on January 1, 2023, after a record population growth of 1,050,110 people from January 1, 2022, to January 1, 2023. This marks the first 12-month period in Canada's history where population grew by over 1 million people, and the highest annual population growth rate (+2.7%) on record since 1957 (+3.3%). This previous record population growth rate in 1957 was related to the high number of births during the post-war baby boom and the high immigration of refugees following the Hungarian Revolution of 1956.

In 2022, the reason behind Canada's record-high population growth was somewhat different, since international migration accounted for nearly all growth recorded (95.9%). Canada is by far leading the G7 countries for population growth in 2022, as has been the case for many years.







Looking Ahead to 2023

CESLM currently has four board members in the Calgary area and two in Edmonton and we would like to add one more. Also, we continue our search for an event planner and a fund development coordinator. We plan to submit at least one more grant application this year and focus on our fall Double Your Donation fundraiser.

Currently, a postcard is in the works to spread the word about our ministry. We anticipate our Spring and Fall Training Events will be hybrid with presenters, participants and exhibitors coming together in person and online. We continue our partnership with Southern Ontario Cooperative of ESL Ministries (SOCEM) to present another online Let's Connect session. We also offer Intercultural Communication Workshops, so please let us know if your church, organization or business is interested in hosting this informative, interactive and fun learning experience.
